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SUMMARY

in the first module of the supporting your child's learning membership we focus on understanding what's happening for your child when they're learning so you can see the different stages as your child is going through them we'll look at how they get interested in new topics and it really doesn't happen very often in response to a parent putting out a beautiful arrangement of toys and books like we so often see on pinterest we'll see how a basic understanding of a

topic leads them to be able to set hypotheses ask more detailed questions and decide what they want to learn and how they want to learn it with your support this can lead to competence autonomy and even a flow state where they get so lost in the joy of learning you'll never need to worry about enticing them to learn again we'll also look at some supplies that will be helpful to have around as your child explores new ideas and how to set

up a learning journal so you can track what they're learning and what you're learning as well
