

Nick Fuentes is radicalizing victimhood

When you work inside any industry, that you tend to have clusters of people. And if you let that start to shape your thinking into treating people like groups instead of like individuals, you are heading down a dark path. And as a parent, we have to teach our kids this because you encounter groupishness because you're a person, because we're a social creature. This pattern recognition we have, this ability for us to tell stories and connect dots can lead us astray morally. Now, as a Christian, I feel it is fundamental to my own morality to treat each person as they come with unique and individual dignity as a creature of God. There are barriers. There are costs. There are problems. You face more problems than I did when I was young. But if you embrace the belief that you are a victim of circumstance and that there are dark forces, and especially dark forces that are all aligned around a race, standing in your way, that is really just an excuse.

That is a scapegoat. And that doesn't help you. That is not in your interest. What Nick is fundamentally selling is poisonous to you. It can feel good. It feels good to be transgressive as a young man, as a young person, as a kid, as teenagers. But if you give up and succumb to that, you have become what you despise. And I just I just don't want that for our boys.
